Marriage More Popular In Nicholas County

NEW YORK, Apr. 17 - Despite the cynicism and the doubting Thomases rampant in Nicholas County are more marriage-minded today than their forbears were.

The proportion of the local population that is married has been increasing steadily over the years. At the same time, there has been a marked drop in the proportion that has remained single.

The latest official figures from the Department of Commerce show that approximately 72.3 percent of the Nicholas County population over age 14 are married.

A breakdown of this figure reveals that 65.2 percent of all men in that age group are married.

On the other hand, during the 70-year span, the proportion of married people rose 8.3 percent, more than making up for the increase in the divorce rate.

Nicholas County's divorce rate, reflecting the national trend, is higher than in the past. The latest figures for the local area show a total of 42 divorces and 54 women remarried.
