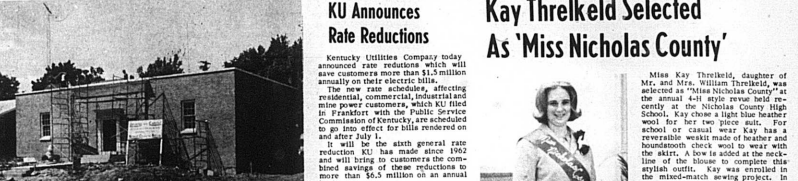
Watts Declares Tobacco Proposal Indefensible

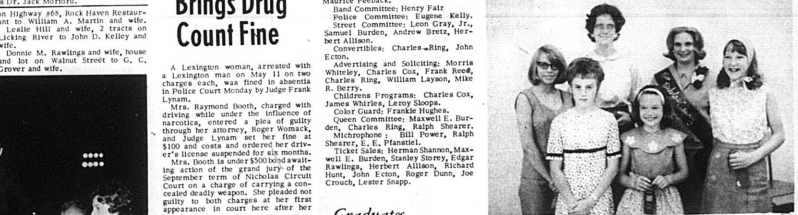


Building Nears Completion
