

### Millersburg Slugs Becoming Nuisance Around Home, U of K. Says

Lexington—Slugs—which look like smalls that have lost their ability to reproduce are becoming a nuisance around some home gardens.

And some of them have invaded gardens, says Dr. Rudy Schellner, U.K. Cooperative Extension Service entomologist. Main offender seems to be a 4- to 5-inch long slug of the Limax group.

CONTROL: Insecticides that are safe to use around the home will NOT be effective against slugs, Dr. Schellner says. Metaldehyde bait, spread in the soil, is the best available protection against slugs. This bait is commercially available.

Slugs leave slimy trails when they crawl, and they will eat a large number of garden plants. They are a close relative to snails. Slugs are found in the country for the best control measure, safety precautions and other data.
