Lexington, Ky.—A wet March changed the picture somewhat on spraying to control the alfalfa weevil, says Dr. H.A. Schreiber, U.K. Cooperative Extension Service leader.

"A dry March was anticipated," he said. "The weevil population would favor application of alfalfa weevil control insecticides when we needed no, however, in many areas of Kentucky alfalfa fields are now so saturated with water that they are not dry enough by the end of March to spray. In fact, the weevil population can get into the fields, 'fly that way' very early in the season, and weevil treatment, in other areas, fields will need to be checked for alfalfa weevil when one touch on the alfalfa shows above weevil damage. 1040 u.s. Individual Taxpayers Ask IRS

The federal tax questions and answers on tax matters is provided by the local office of the U.S. Internal Revenue Service and is published as a public service to taxpayers. The column answers questions most frequently asked by taxpayers.

Q—My buddy says you can deduct all your medical insurance premiums this year and I say only half of them can be deducted. Who's right?

A—In a way, you both are. Premiums paid for medical insurance have always been deductible as a medical expense by taxpayers who limit their deductions.

For 1967 however, one-half of these premiums up to \$100 may be deducted without regard to the requirement that medical expense be reduced by three percent of the taxpayer's income.

In effect, the new rule on medical insurance premiums allows a deduction for part of these premiums even when the taxpayer's ordinary medical expenses don't exceed three percent of his income. The 1968 instructions explain this in detail.

1040 u.s. Individual Taxpayers Ask IRS

Q—I'm expecting a refund but don't have one of the envelopes you're supposed to use to mail the refund. What should I do?

A—You may return to the Internal Revenue Center for your area. You can obtain the correct address by checking page 10 of the 1040 instructions or by calling the local Internal Revenue office.

Q—Are membership fees in a charitable organization like the YMCA deductible as a contribution?

A—No, dues, membership fees and assessments paid to a charitable organization are not deductible if you return. However, you may deduct gifts you make to a qualified organization.

Q—I've been supporting my mother since she retired. Can I claim her as a dependent?

A—If your mother had gross income of \$500 or more last year you cannot claim her as a dependent. Check the 1040 instructions for full details on the dependency tests.

Q—My losses from stock transactions were greater than my gains last year. Can I carry over any of my unused capital losses from 1967 to 1968 profits?

A—Yes. Unused capital losses may be carried over from year to year until they are used against taxable capital gains in a given year. If you have permitted-percentage persons to receive their share of the losses, at least 10 percent of their "retirement income." This provision is explained in detail in Form 1040. Copies are available at many banks, post offices and local IRS offices.

Q—I had to hire someone last year to take care of my children. Can my wife who is recovering from an operation be able to take a child-care deduction for her 90 days or more?

A—There are limitations on this deduction. The 1040 instructions explain this in detail.

Q—My bank sent me a statement of my savings account. Should I send this with my return?

A—No, interest or dividend statements with your return are not required.

Q—I got married last year. Do I need another Social Security number since my name changed?

A—No, continue to use your same number but notify the Social Security Administration that your name has changed so they can change your name up to date. Don't forget to put your new name on any tax returns you file. Failure to do so may deprive you of many tax advantages.

Q—I held two jobs last year, and too much was withheld for Social Security. How do I get it back?

A—If more than \$200.00 was withheld for Social Security in 1967 because you had two or more employers, you may take a credit for the over-withholding against your income tax. Enter the overpayment on line 18 of Page 1 of Form 1040.

Q—Is the Federal tax pay on my monthly phone bill deductible?

A—No, Federal excise taxes are not deductible.

Q—Are special assessments or service charges paid by homeowners deductible?

A—Local assessments for sidewalks or other additions that improve the value of your property are generally not deductible. Water bills and similar utility charges are not deductible either.

Q—My son is stationed in Vietnam with the Marines. What do we do about his tax return?

A—Military personnel in a Combat zone do not have to file tax returns while stationed there. They may wait until they are home to file their taxes. If you are a dependent of a soldier or sailor who is stationed in Vietnam, you may be able to deduct the fair market value of the stock he owned for the year.

Q—My daughter married last fall. What will her tax return be like if she files jointly with her husband? Will she be able to deduct any of my moving expenses?

A—On a joint return, the \$100 minimum applied to each job or does it cover all losses for the year? We suffered storm and flood damage last year.

A—The 1040 limitation applies to each separate non-business casualty. Losses which exceed this limitation also are not reimbursed by insurance may be deducted as non-business casualty losses.

Q—I moved when I changed jobs last year. Can I deduct any of my moving expenses?

A—You may be able to deduct some of these expenses if certain conditions are met and explained in the 1040 instructions.

Q—A copy of Form 9031, which can be obtained by dropping a post card to your local IRS office, has further information on this deduction. Form A-10.
