Safety Habits So Easy To Learn, But Their Omission Can Be Tragic

The Kentucky Humane Federation, receiving from many grants in Kentucky complaints regarding cruelty to animals, has issued a booklet "How to be a humane." It says that a bill, and thanks to humane-minded legislators, the following laws (connected) were enacted, making Kentucky the first progressive state in its protection for animals.

LES 434.010 CUELTY TO ANIMALS. Penalty, \$100, to \$1,000, imprisonment one year, or both.

LES 434.593 INHUMANE POISONING OF KILLING DUMPS. PENALTY: \$100, to \$1,000, imprisonment one year, or both.

LES 434.595 STEALING DOMESTIC ANIMALS--POSSESSION OF SAME. Fine, \$50 to \$500, or imprisonment one year, (possession knowing), same, even though principal offender not convicted.

LES 436.597 ABANDONMENT OF DOG OR CAT. Fine \$25 to \$50.

LES 436.600 DYING OR SELLING DYING BABY CHICKS, DUCKLINGS, OTHER FOWL OR RABBITS. Prohibit selling - giving away same (colored or not colored) under two months of age in any quantity less than six. Fine, \$100 to \$500.

These statutes can be invoked by any citizen when necessary. The Federation will investigate all serious complaints, any citizen in this State, and will be glad to help with organization of humane groups upon request.

Letting you know that small step—the one that makes practicing safety, says L. K. Coopers, Extension Service. This week if Farm Safety Week—and the observance nice (with emphasis) that the "small step" saves lives or limbs.

For instance:

(1) You have only one pair of eyes—and it takes just a second to put on protective goggles or glasses when doing the kind of work where flying fragments can damage your eyes.

(2) When you have a jam in power-operated equipment (saw, etc.) stop the power at the source before you clear the jam. NEVER try to clear a jam while the equipment is still running.

(3) If you work on a vehicle, be sure the wheels are blocked (to prevent rolling) or that the vehicle is safely propped up (blocked) with sturdy materials.

(4) It takes only a second to read the label on a chemical container. Take that second. You may save lives of humans or livestock.

(5) Don't work by stairs or ladders or other farm equipment. Simply carry the gear for which the equipment is designed—and no more.

(6) Put full bars (or overhead protective devices) on cranes. Once these big machines start to roll over, there is no turning back.
