The scientists claim that "edible soybean protein isolate," and the synthetic or substituted food products made from it are important. You may be in the latter years of this century, greatly acknowledge it for its protein content. It is world production continues to increase at present rates, and food sources continue to be strained productively. ESPMI may indeed be a major protein source. For India, China, Indonesia, Iran, Turkey and Egypt, the day of hunger may come sooner. Some specialists say it can be in the 1970's. This relatively new "synthetic" food made from the protein extracted from the ubiquitous soybeans--could fill the gap.

One reason: Animal production over the world will average production about 43 pounds of edible protein an acre. An acre of soybeans will produce an average of 450 pounds of usable protein annually. Right now, the product is generally used in the beginning stage, but some companies are producing it steadily. The products are available in limited areas.

It's questionable whether one would call it a "synthetic" or "substitute." Actually, the products are a genuine food item per se.

Hunger can mean to be vegetarians, persons on medically assigned diets that prescribe protein sources other than wheat, red meat, or on diets that are low fat.

One company--Worthington Foods, Inc., Worthington, Ohio--has developed a product that it "legitimately" acceptable.

Using the soybean extract as a base, they manufacture a most useful brand of wafers. Vegetarian luncheon slices are furnished, packaged to taste and look like smoked beef, smoked turkey, or smoked ham.
