Just a Dress Rehearsal
The coach of the nation's best basketball team, Johnny Wooden at U.C.L.A., says December is the "basketball laboratory." What Wooden means is that few conference games are played in the first month of the season and coaches can experiment, find the weaknesses and make an effort to patch them up. This month the league races get underway and for all conference teams, this is what really matters. The league champions get the invita-

tation to the NCAA Tournament, and that's what the season is all about anyway.
Kentucky has played one Southeastern Conference game already and passed with flying colors with a win over Florida. Coach Adolph Rupp seems to have come up with a bonafide title contender with the sophomore-dominated team. The draft schedule, formed well in advance, has been almost unbroken schedule. All night games, and all but ONE are away from the home court. The Wildcats begin the new year with a match late on day night in Nashville on a Monday nationally ranked Commodore. They travel on to Alabama for a Monday match with the Crimson Tide. During December Kentucky played with Kentucky gaining a national ranking. But from here on is when it counts. These are the conference games courts. These are the ones that REALLY matter.

Cover Crops Cut Winter Feed Bills

Lexington, Ky.--If high quality hay is short on your farm, grass sheep on cover crops of rye or wheat, says Dr. Monty Chappell, D.V.M., Cooperative Extension Service sheep specialist. Small grade goats won't be adversely affected by such fall and winter grazing, and may even be helped. Keep these points in mind in grazing cover crops:
(1) Drench ewes six weeks prior to lambing and prior to turning cover crops to keep pastures clean.
(2) Do not graze cover crops until you need to. It is valuable, and can be of good use to ewes six weeks before and after lambing.
(3) If cover crops are lush, try to restrict animals to certain areas of the field, and rotate them regularly.
(4) Lambs do well on green feed after weaning. If lambs are dropped by Dec. 15, they can be weaned on off cover crops a week before putting the lambs on. Freezing weather will help clean up parasites.
(5) You may want to feed a limited amount of dry roughage to ewes grazing wheat and rye pastures. Even low quality hay (roughage) may prevent scour, if crops become rank and heavy from extended rains.
(6) Have water, feed and water ready in case bad weather hits while animals are on cover crops. Bad weather cuts off the feed supply and puts stress on ewes in advanced pregnancy, ketosis and loss of ewes and lambs may occur.
(7) Be sure there is a source of clean water, salt, calcium and phosphorus at all times.
