Vacation Driving On Limited Access Highways

Frankfort—Commissioner W. O. Neuman announced today that he has announced, "Lack of foresight and planning are probably the major reasons for the present emergency vacation driving on limited access highways."

He requested motorists planning to drive on limited access highways to familiarize themselves with the interchange and exits they will be using during their trip.

One of the greatest problems encountered after getting on a limited access highway is what to do if your car becomes disabled.

Neuman stated he has received numerous inquiries from motorists who had no knowledge of what to do with their car when it became disabled on an interstate highway. He gave the following suggestions for those drivers who have to stop on an interstate:

• Never slow down suddenly; attempt to alert the person behind you by flashing your brakes two or three times and slow down.

• Get off the road at once. Unless your car is completely disabled, attempt to get to the nearest exit and get completely off the roadway. If this is impossible, get your car as far off the shoulder as possible.

• Warn the motorist behind you when you are stalled by turning on your "hazard flashers" or flashing headlights.

• Once your car has stopped, attempt to get aid and try to avoid leaving your car on the interstate for a prolonged time. Traffic regulations for all limited access highways prohibit any disabled car from parking on the shoulders of a road for more than six continuous hours, after that, the car may be towed away at the owner's cost.

Neuman stated, "Using disabled and having to stop on an interstate highway is as dangerous as having to stop on a railroad track, and can create tragedy for those involved unless they know how to handle the situation."

In our days of road widening, the subject of senseless killings, we must not forget to our citizens that death on the highways observed frequently in this state, is preventable. "The statistics on deaths on the interstate are appalling enough, but sometimes we forget that the statistics in a human service are the same. If we can come to this realization and feel a genuine respect for the sufferer, his dependents, then, and only then, can we hope that statistics will have any meaningful affect on the people."

WANT A COOLER HOUSE?

Keeping the house cool is one of many concerns you have as the day would never arrive a few weeks ago.

If you are fortunate enough to have air conditioning you have no problem. Just remember to keep the filter clean. The air is an important advantage of air conditioning. Many systems have filters which are to be taken care of and used of your air conditioner.

Keeping the house cool is accomplished by good insulation, keeping the hot air off the walls, glass areas and roof, and possible blowing the summer sun out and yet allowing the winter sun in. This means the use of well placed overhangs and locating most of the large glass areas on the south side of the house so that when the sun is directly above in summer it will not shine directly on the glass areas. On the other hand when the sun is low in the south, the large windows and warm the house, curtains shading outside such as awnings, blinds, draperies with insulated linings, bowered trees and shade trees on the east, south and west sides are effective means of curtailing the sun rays. Light-colored reflecting walls and should be remembered. Large paved areas should be shaded when next to the house, especially on the west side.

It may be too late for planting which would give shade with maybe the exception of quick growing vines on trellises, but outdoor screens or awnings to protect the glass areas is still a possibility. A well ventilated attic is another aid to reducing heat in the house. Hip roof need continuous soffit ventilation. Louvers placed in gable ends allow air passage through attic space. By adding soffit ventilation can be circulated through the home.

Because air continues to flow within the room in the same direction as it enters, the placement of windows is very important. The most effective air movement is obtained when openings are on opposite walls.

By operating fans either attic or window during the night cooler night air can be circulated through the home.
