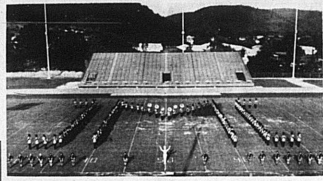


Harrison Rural Electric Meet To Be Held July 15

The Harrison Rural Electric Co-operative's annual membership meeting will be held on July 15, at the Harrison Electric Farm on Highway No. 992, 1/2 mile south of Cynthiana. New Withholding Rates

The Internal Revenue Service today announced that July 14 is the effective date for withholding rates to reflect the new 10 percent surcharge on individual income tax, under provisions of the law signed by the President on June 28.

Wages paid on and after July 14, 1966, are subject to the increased withholding.

To assist in making the change-over to the new rates, a new edition of the Employer's Tax Guide, (Circular E) was recently mailed to all employers.

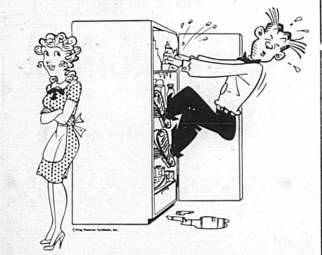

Poison Ivy, Oak, and Sumac

Many people claim that they are highly susceptible to poison ivy, but are likely unaffected by poison oak or poison sumac. This is probably not true, according to the National Institute of Health, for the substance which causes the allergic rash and blisters is found on all parts of all these plants. That a person who contracts poison ivy must likely also will react to poison oak and poison sumac. The skin reaction from the allergic rash and blisters of every 100 people, varies with the individual's sensitivity and amount of exposure.

Guides both work clothing, camping gear, etc., and advise about the plants which cause the allergic rash and blisters is potentially dangerous. Children should be warned about the plants which may cause an allergic reaction to the mouth or in the nasal area as the plant is crushed.

The most important measures are prevention measures. Wear protective clothing and avoid contact. If the rash does occur, wash immediately with soap and water to remove the irritant. Clothing which has been made contact with urushiol in the case of spraying should be thoroughly washed.

A drying lotion helps relieve itching. If symptoms are severe, a physician should be consulted.
