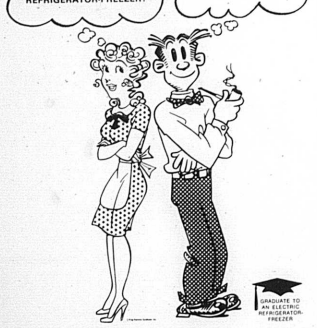

Employment Tax Return Deadline

Louisville, Ky.—Employers have an important tax deadline on July 31, 1968 according to Mr. Robert J. Dill, District Director of Internal Revenue.

This is the due date for reporting and paying both withheld income and social security taxes for the quarter ending June 30, 1968.

Employers should report these taxes on the predated Form 941 for finished forms. Employers have until July 15, 1968 to file their return provided that the quarterly tax liability has been fully and timely paid the Federal Reserve Bank or authorized commercial bank.

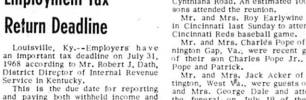
