Kentucky Dairymen Approve Promotional Assessment Fund

The American Dairy Association... "While the turnout was disappointing," Miller stated, "it felt that the program can provide some needed assistance. The assessment program went into effect Oct. 15. According to Miller, the final tabulation of a very tight vote was 84 voting in favor of the program and 634 voting against. The state-wide referendum among commercial milk producers was conducted Sept. 21. Under the check-off plan, dairy farmers who sell milk for fluid use will pay four cents per hundred pounds into the promotional research fund. Those who sell milk for manufactured products—butter, cheese, dried milk and ice cream will pay three cents a hundred pounds.

The American Dairy Association... "The promotional fund which has been used by the cooperatives has proved to be a very effective program. It has made it possible to do a great deal of research, market development and advertising that a greater effort must be made in the areas of research, market development and advertising."

"We feel that this is necessary if our dairy industry is to compete with filled milk, imitations and substitutes," Miller stated.

"The Commission went on to say, 'promotion is a vital part of any competitive industry. Agriculture is certainly a competitive industry and will grow more competitive in the years ahead. If we are to promote, we must have the money to conduct promotional projects.'"

Miller stated, "one of Kentucky's top three agricultural enterprises is the production of quality dairy. It kept pace with the expansion of the industry. However, almost all this will have been in vain if we are not able to research, market and develop what we produce. This can be carried on with funds made available."

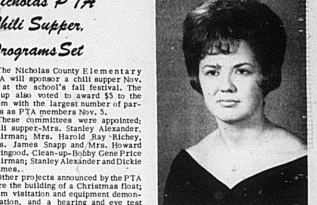
