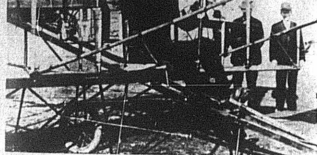

## Determining Tobacco Acreage For Strip or Skip Row Pattern

Harvey Wagner, chairman of Nicholas County Agricultural Stabilization and Conservation Committee, reminded tobacco farmers today special rules apply to measurement of tobacco acreage in a strip or row pattern. He said if an adjustment of excess tobacco acreage made in skip-row manner does not meet the requirements, a farmer must have at least 4 normal rows in which only the land actually devoted to tobacco will be counted.



**FIRST AIRPLANE** to land in Nicholas County, according to Roy L. Shannon, was on Saturday afternoon, August 5, 1916. The pioneer aviator John Stockton Fair, when his plane developed engine trouble while flying over Carlisle, he landed on Carlton Lamborn's farm on the East Union road near Carlisle. He landed on the runway. He remained in Carlisle over night and repaired the damaged parts Sunday morning, then took off and was again forced to land at Pleasant Valley where he remained a few days waiting for parts. The airplane was a 1913 model Curtiss pusher-type biplane, with tricycle type landing gear and powered with a Curtiss 12-hp. "Redwing" V-type water-cooled engine. The plane had a cruising speed of 50 miles per hour. The early days, no two airplanes were made alike. Pioneer airplanes were not licensed by the government until 1926. In 1911 the Aero Club of America, which was government controlled, awarded pilot license No. 1 to Earl Hill, which was of the above airplane. No. 4 went to Orville Wright and No. 3 to Walter Wright. Stockton was not a licensed pilot. Shortly after leaving Nicholas County, Stockton was accidentally killed by the propeller of his airplane at Lexington.

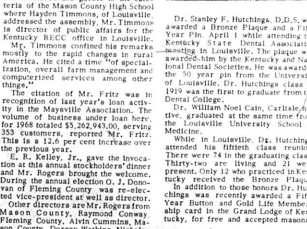


**Babe Ruth Tryouts Set For Saturday**
