Peace Corps Placement Test

Nicholas County area residents interested in putting their skills to use in development around the world are invited to take the Peace Corps Placement Test. The test will be held at the Nicholas County Public Library, 1200 N. Main St., Lexington, Ky., on Saturday, February 15, at Room 433, Federal Building. The Peace Corps uses the Placement Test to determine if an applicant can best be utilized overseas. The test measures general aptitude, the ability to learn a language, and education of achievement. The test requires no preparation and is non-competitive; an applicant can neither pass nor fail. Persons interested in serving with the Peace Corps must fill out an Application. If they have not already done so, and present it to the nearest before the test. Application forms are available from post-offices or from the Peace Corps in Washington, D. C. 20525. Fifteen thousand Volunteers are currently serving in Asia, Africa, Latin America and the Pacific Islands, working with the people of those nations in self-help projects ranging from food production to health education. More Volunteers are needed for programs which will begin this spring and summer.
