

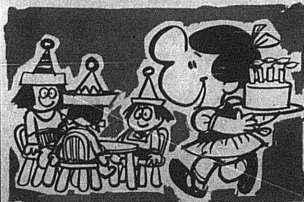

The company supplies electricity, according to W.A. Deacon, Lexington-KU supervisor. Power plants, transmission and distribution construction plans to meet the increasing demands of industrial, commercial and residential users are scheduled. A total of about \$17.5 million is to be spent during 1969 on the 427,000-kilowatt generating addition to the E.W. Brown power plant at Dix Dam. The unit, now under construction, is expected to begin commercial operation in May, 1971. Total cost of the new coal-fired steam electric unit and related facilities is estimated at \$28,720,000. It will increase the plant's consumption of Kentucky coal from a half million tons to 1 1/2 million tons a year.
