Grass-Field 'Tearing Up' Work Okay In Pasture Renovation

Winter is the best time to "tear up" grass fields for seeding to legumes next spring, in pasture-renovation work. Farmers should have grazed these fields closely by now, to make tillage easier, says Warren Thompson, U. S. Cooperative Extension Service forage specialist. Soils should have been tested, and limed and fertilized according to recommendations, too.

For the "tear-up" project, use a disk, bush-and-bog, field cultivator or field tiller. Set the blades nearly straight, he says, so the soil is chopped rather than cut loose. It usually will take two passes with the equipment to do the best job, though often at this time of year, one pass will do.

Year losses 50 percent or more of good seed. On thin, weak grass stands, expose 40 to 60 percent of the surface. Leave the ground rough. On slopes, till on the contour to prevent erosion.

Do not smooth the ground until just before seeding. Do this about mid-February to mid-March.

Check with area extension offices for detailed instructions on grass-field renovation, Mr. Thompson says.

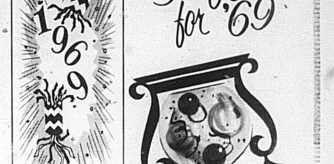
