Management Of Calves Urged By UK Specialist

Full-dropped beef calves need careful management, says Dr. Roy C. Gray, Jr., U. K. Cooperative Extension Service beef cattle specialist.

"I have these practices: (1) Castrate the calves as soon as possible, before they, and vaccinate for blackleg and malignant edema at the same time. Castration is done.

(2) Start mixing Vitamin A with the salt about Thanksgiving time. Mix 300 (international unit) vitamin A per pound of house salt. Add feed (free choice) for each half-ounce of that salt.

(3) Pick a warm day and spray all cattle with the right insecticide against external parasites. This holds down lice and mite buildup.

(4) If you plan to breed for a 1969 calf, you will need to breed for a 1968 calf.

(5) Make calcium and phosphorus (at least bone meal and dicalcium phosphate) available to cattle for mineral requirements.

(6) The sure calves have plenty of good, clean water this winter. They need it, but just as much as in other seasons.
