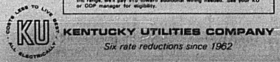

**Bureau Of Investigation Seeking Burglary Ring**

FRANKFORT—The Kentucky State Police Bureau of Investigation is currently seeking a ring of about 100 burglars believed responsible for a series of jewelry store break-ins which recently occurred in the Northern and Central areas of the state.  
 None of the stolen articles, valued at more than \$50,000, have been recovered to date.  
 Lt. Alvin S. Roberts, investigation Bureau Commander, described the ring as "a highly professional team of burglars using the latest techniques in safe cracking and forcible entry."

**Watch Out For Older Pedestrians**

"This is the danger season when drivers need to be on the alert for older pedestrians," according to Hillis H. Yampol, Executive Director, Metropolitan Chicago Nursing Home Association, he pointed out that longer hours of darkness, fog, snow and rain make it harder for drivers to see and stop in time.  
 "For data on older persons should avoid jaywalking," he said, "when they walk, they should try to avoid jaywalking." he said.  
 "When they walk, they should try to avoid the hours between 4 p.m. and midnight, and they should remember that Fridays, Saturdays, and Sundays are the worst accident days.  
 "Drivers must see to avoid collisions with other cars or pedestrians."

**Barometers**

A barometer often is considered the gift for "the man who has everything." Christmas gift barometers do not always work as well as advertised. Many of the first show readings which coincide exactly with those given by local newspaper, television or radio reports, says Albin E. Elam Jr., who knows a lot about barometers.  
 "But this is not because the donor has given an inferior, or faulty gift," says the state climatologist and weather historian at the University of Kentucky.  
 "Your Christmas barometer may simply require a few adjustments which you can make yourself, using the instruction sheet usually included with barometers," says Elam. It is wise to go at it carefully and with full knowledge of what your barometer is, and what it tells you.  
 Barometers use a column of mercury to measure the atmospheric pressure—the weight of the air around you. It is a type of scale which gives readings in inches of mercury.  
 Elam's insight reports usually indicate the possibility of fair weather to come, and falling pressure down.

**Rowan Horseback Riding Trail Open**

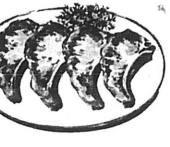
