Parks at Park Ferry, I listened to the steady "tick-tack" of the warring flutter, and the clear sound of the bell which followed as it struck the hour.

There was a lot to see, and much to learn from a careful look at the old clock. It stood in the corner of Grandpa's living room farthest away from the open fire which heated the room. This location provided a more even temperature assuring greater accuracy of the clock by reason of its temperature change in the length of

the pendulum in its swing back and forth in every second. It was treated to open the door of the cabinet and watch the light glimmer on the brass head of the pendulum as it swung back and forth, and see the two brass weights suspended on each side by cables, and to watch Grandpa as he

discussed recent notations of record having been made by Grandpa in 1934, and again in 1936. My father, a classmate of mine in the Carlisle Normal School, was present in 1936, the death of Thompson S. Parks in 1938, the clock came with Aunt Jennie, to our home in Carlisle where it remained until her death and mother's, when it and mother's "Coca-Cola" piano were shipped to my home in Michigan, and consequently, the clock to my son's home in Perfield, New York, where it now stands up against the wall, and I hope will continue to give food memories in the years to come for my three grandchildren, whom I hope will cherish even more than I, this rich family heritage associated through four generations with our own GRANDFATHER'S CLOCK.

Wound up these weights to insure the running of the clock for another week. The "Face" of the clock was equally interesting, for it shows the Phase of the Moon and the day of the Month, and had a map of the East and West Hemisphere of the Earth. On these maps were many names and details of particular interest as indicative of the age of the clock. For example, who is now the Pacific Ocean, was named "Pacific Ocean," or the Great South Sea, Australia was called "New Holland," and southeast Asia was designated "Tartary" by the reason of the discovery by the Tartars from China. Determine when the last designation of these areas were made and you will find a fair idea of when this clock was manufactured.
