Water Resources Reference Work Published At U of K

The subject of Kentucky's water resources—how and where they occur and how they are used by the people of all Kentuckians—is covered in a new reference work, "Water Resources of Kentucky," a research department at the University of Kentucky.

The 51-page publication, titled "Water Resources of Kentucky," was prepared by Dr. Wallace W. Hagan, state geologist and director of KGS, and is presented in a special publication to the public to help it become more knowledgeable as to the nature of water, its movements, its characteristics, its availability and the need for its wise management and use.

"Water in Kentucky" is written in nontechnical language and is designed to explain basic concepts of water, and to clarify water facts and problems, he added.

What are some of the things of which this businessman speaks? In the words of the oil company executive, "...a big problem facing businessmen such as ours in this country today is young people that they can contribute to business, and that business can make an important contribution to society.... The logical question that young people should ask themselves is how else than through the productive machinery of business and industry can the high goals of the next generation be achieved?"

FBI Director J. Edgar Hoover quoted former President Calvin Coolidge in the "100 Law Enforcement Bulletin," as saying, "It is the duty of a citizen not only to observe the law but to let it be known that he is opposed to its violation." Mr. Hoover further elaborated, "An overwhelming majority of present-day Americans obey the law, but far too few indicate that they are actively concerned with its violation. If we are to live as civilized men and women, then we must make the law a paramount issue in our daily lives. In short, we must live by the spirit as well as the letter of the law."

Schwann Awarded Honorary Degree
William Schwann, publisher of the Schwann Catalog of Records was awarded an honorary of Doctor of Music degree by the University of Louisville on June 28.

Mr. Schwann's interest in music began when as a young child he learned to play the organ with such ability that at the age of 15 he was the regular church organist at the Christian Church here. At that time his father was minister of the church. His mother, Mrs. Henry Schwann lives in Gas City, Ind.
