OMAR CLAYTON CURTIS—A well-liked gambler wound took the life of a 45-year-old farming Community man at his home near Elizabethtown about 1:30 p.m. Wednesday, June 4.

Fleming County Coroner Bobby Jones said Omar Clayton Curtis of Ewing Road 1 died of a 12-page shotgun wound in the forehead. Jones said Curtis was shot in the forehead. Curtis' wife, Mrs. Mary Lee Curtis, and one of his sons, Jerry, 17 were in their beds at the time of the incident and at the scene of the incident rushed into the living room where they found Curtis' body slumped onto the floor.

There was no definite reason given for Curtis' action other than reports that he had been depressed for the past two or three weeks.
