County Field Day Set for July 10

The County Field Day scheduled for July 10 on the farm of Charles and Fred Whaley will be primarily to show a variety of farming practices and facilities that can be adapted or built by the average farmer.

Their entire project required a revision of existing buildings and some new installations. The best cattle program resulted in the building of a silo and a pole barn. The farm shop and tool shed are built largely of farm produced poles and lumber.

Minimum tillage corn plots will be seen. Some tobacco varieties may be seen, along with self-made "moozers" to get the tobacco from the field to the barn. Excellent pastures that resulted from good management may be seen. Ponds, pipelines, spring development and water tanks are utilized at working

tools for the farm operations. Diversion channels, waterways and tile lines are some of the soil and water conservation practices that may be seen.

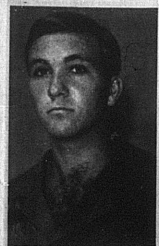
