The group, known as the ABM Study Group, was organized to study the merits of the ABM system in light of the current state of the art. The group's report, which is being prepared for the Joint Chiefs of Staff, is expected to be completed by the end of the year. The report will discuss the technical, economic, and political aspects of the ABM system. The group's members include some of the leading experts in the field of anti-ballistic missiles. 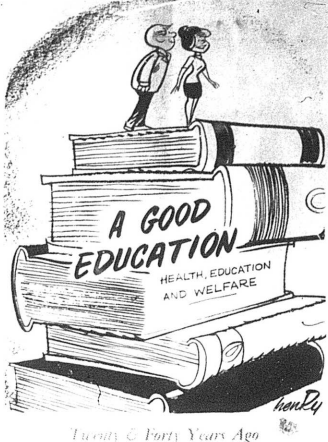

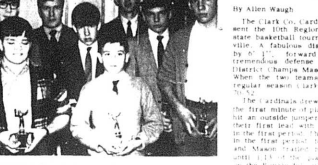

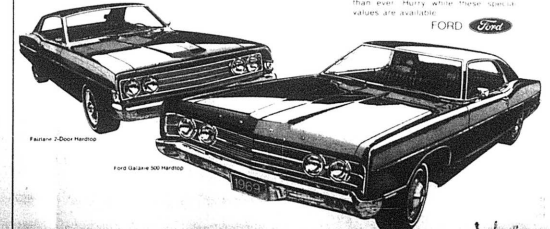
