An "inherited" postal deficit of \$1.2 billion is responsible for the proposed raise in postage bills for residents of Carlisle, Postmaster John Anderson said today.

Mr. Anderson said he had been advised by Postmaster General William S. Hunt in Washington, D.C., that the record \$1.2 billion deficit caused by President Nixon to work postage rate increases. Without higher rates the Department will be left with a staggering deficit that would become an added public tax burden.

In addition to increasing letter mail from 6 to 7 cents, as proposed by the Johnson Administration, First Assistant Postmaster General James H. Dill has already established by previous postal orders.

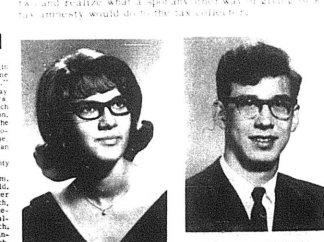
