World, by William Evans. From the tiny set to the large portfolio, editions of all sizes and types use their own unique language in bodysurfing, defense, courtship, mating and caring for their young.

A Constitutional Faith, by Hugo Black. With vigor and clarity, Justice Black makes explicit beliefs about the relationship of the courts, the Congress, and the Constitution.

Early American Furniture Makers, by Thomas Ormsbee. This account is concerned not so much with types of our early furniture, as with the men and the times that produced them.

A Fringe of Blue, by Joyce Kilmer. The fascinating and frank reminiscences of an extraordinary woman who has devoted her life to the service of others throughout the world.

God in The White House by Edmund Fuller and David Greer. This account of the James M. Smiths' lives is a thoroughly researched account of the religious background, development of religious influence and the effect of the religious beliefs of each of the incumbents.

La Salle: The Life and Times of an Explorer by John Ferrell. An excellent biography which paints a portrait of the famous explorer and the adventures which were never far from danger.

Living At Mt. Vernon by James H. Hinkle. The warm and hopeful human drama of the first successful heart transplant told in the patient's own words.

The Last Queen by Norval Latta. A beautiful historical novel based on the life of George III's eldest Princess Caroline. Her marriage brought her a throne and whose secret father by Irene Carey. 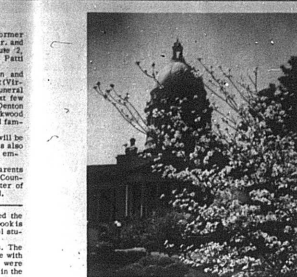
Starting From Scratch by Joanna Murray. A delightful introduction to the intricate details of a full of common sense tips for every homemaker.

you have one or more dependents. A wife income and the size of your estate are factors which must also be considered.

Q—I am a disabled veteran eligible for vocational rehabilitation and would like to know if I can take part-time training. I would like to train for a better paying job, but can't afford to quit my present job and take full-time training because I have a wife and two children to support.

A—Since July 26, 1968, as the result of Public Law 90-431, it has been possible for service-disabled veterans in need of vocational rehabilitation to take part-time training and be paid a proportionate assistance allowance by VA. The present full-time allowance is \$110 monthly for a veteran with no dependents, \$150 for one dependent, and \$175 for more than one dependent. Under the new law, the allowance for three-quarter time training will be \$60, \$110, and \$130 respectively. For half-time training the allowance will be \$35, \$72, and \$85.

A—Yes. The place of burial makes no difference. The \$250 allowance is paid toward the total funeral expenses.

The Extraordinary Jug-Of-War, by Letta Schatz. A colorful picture-book about a hare who outwits both Hippo, catwoman and I get lost the biggest bees of all.

Citizens Triumph, by Vernon Pizer. The athletes who are written about in this book are linked by a common bond of achieving their triumph in spite of adversity.

If I Had... by Mercer Mayer. A small picture book six children filled with the wistful dreaming of a small boy.

The Royal Virginian, by George Frank. A thrilling historical novel that takes place in the year 1659 and concerns the ship, the Royal Virginian, and its adventures after coming to large from the Virginia colony. This book is written on the junior high level.

Lucy by Catherine Storr. A funny and exciting story for children in grades 1 to 5, set in the neighborhood family, set out to catch some thieves and finds that being as brave as a boy is not quite as easy as it seemed.

The Mystery of Island Keep, by Hilma Boden. A spine-tling story set against the lovely countryside of Scotland. Junior high school students will enjoy this mystery.

North Atlantic Jet Flight, by Leonard A. Stevens. This is a behind-the-scenes account of a jet flight across the Atlantic Ocean from the eastern United States to central Europe. This is a book for upper elementary school students.

The Oval Playground, by William Campbell Gault. An exciting story of dirt-track auto racing for boys in junior or senior high school.

Runaway Raft, by Ruth Harnden. An exciting adventure story for upper elementary and junior high students about Bart and the raft he builds on the river.

Save Alice, by Eva-Lis Wurto. A mystery for students in grades 5-8. Alice is a caged cockatoo that turns a group of young people's European eighting trip into a suspenseful, right-filled, and humorous chase.

Species, by Ellen Rankin. An imaginative, laughable picture book about a child who needs and gets glasses.

Stolen By The Indians, by Dorothy Heiderstein. This book for upper elementary grade students contains the true accounts of young people who were captured by the Indians and plunged suddenly into an alien life, sometimes kinder than the one they had left, sometimes cruel and hard.

The Thirteen Days Of Yule, illustrated by Nancy Heggen. In this picture book for children in first to third grade, Nancy Heggen has restored life to this rich, merry, almost-forgotten Scottish lyric.

The Wicked Pigeon Ladies in The Garden, by Mary Chase. A good contemporary gothic story for those in grades 3 to 5. It centers on nine-year-old Maureen Swanson, known by the neighborhood kids as "Old Stinky" who prefers to imagine herself as Maureen M. as a writer, owner of the new board-up, once grand, Old Measman Place in town.
