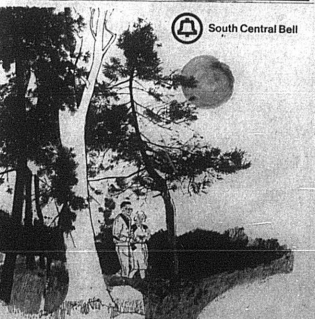

Thanksgiving Recipes

Mrs. Woodrow Barber of Morehead, the former Maple Williams of Lawrence County, had contributed this recipe for apple cranberry juice. She is on the faculty at Morehead State University.
 1 stick of cinnamon
 1/2 cup sugar
 1 cup water
 1 quart of ginger ale
 18 whole cranberries
 3 cups cranberry juice
 2 tbsp. lemon juice
 The spices in cheesecloth bag, put in a pot, with the sugar, water and cranberry juice. Simmer 20 minutes. Chill, leaving bag of spices in liquid till ready to serve. Pour over ice and add ginger ale before serving. Makes enough for 18—including Grandpa and Grandma.
 Mary Bigcat Helton of New York City who came to West Liberty as the World War II bride of the late Clyde Helton brought with her a fascinating accent from her native Drangemouth, Scotland and a competence in her skill and expertise in foods. Since many eastern Kentucky men had married her at the Thanksgiving table, Mrs. Helton's rabbit stew recipe has been selected in preference to her Chicken Marie La Nicotie. Cut rabbit into six pieces, wash, drain and marinate overnight in olive oil containing thyme and salt (or a mild vinegar can be used). Roll pieces in flour and fry in butter. Then put in Dutch oven. Fry salt pork and add to the rabbit. Add 1/2 cup of some good stock and simmer till done. Dish and slice over the gravy and pour over rabbit. Garnish with boiled tomatoes.
 Mrs. James M. Perry of West Liberty contributed to the book her recipe for scalloped oysters. Drain 1 pint of scallops. Combine 1/2 cup cream and 1/2 cup dry bread crumbs and pour over these. Fry in melted butter. Place to
