## High School Press Clinic; Six Local Students to Attend

A new event—a multimedia round-table has been added to the program of the Kentucky High School Press Clinic set for Friday, Oct. 17, at the University of Kentucky.

These local students will attend the University of Kentucky. The round-table is arranged for students, and teachers interested in the clinic will be invited to attend for communicating news and other information to high schools, according to J.A. McCleary, clinic director and assistant chairman of the UK Department of Journalism, which is sponsoring the clinic.

Students or teachers who have tapes of school newscasts, film strips and strips or student-made movies are invited to bring them to the clinic. Each Kentucky high school may enroll six students and one teacher, and each student should be assigned to work on a topic. Prof. McCleary said. All meetings will be held in the UK Journalism Building and the Student Center.

Workshops will be featured for business directors, editors, feature writers, news writers, photographing sports writers and sportswriters. Sessions also will be held on mimeograph and offset production.

Free examinations for Glaucoma, the second greatest cause of blindness in the United States, will be available in Mt. Sterling, Monday, Oct. 20.

The clinic will be conducted by four well qualified doctors in a building on West Main Street, next door to the Mt. Sterling National Bank, from 9:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. The examinations take only five minutes.

The free Glaucoma screening is being sponsored by the Mt. Sterling Lions Club, Montgomery County Health Department, Kentucky Society for the Prevention of Blindness and the Kentucky State Health Department.

## More Money On Tap In County

Despite the tight money situation that prevails today, there is a plentiful supply of money on tap in Nicholas County.

A government survey shows that the volume of currency in circulation locally is at a high level. Most of it is in the hands of banks and in the tills of merchants.

The seemingly contradictory situation of tight money and ample supply has been created, in large measure, by the Federal Reserve Board in its efforts to combat inflation. It limits the amount of credit a bank may extend by requiring the bank to keep a larger part of its funds in reserve. The amount of money on deposit in
