Annual County Tobacco Festival

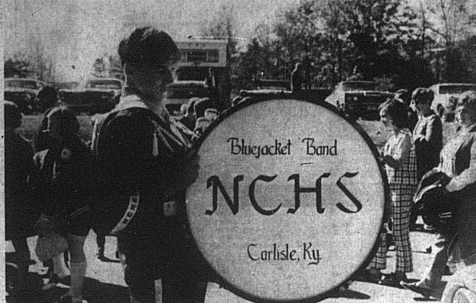
