

**CAPTAIN ROBERT H. BRADSHAW**  
 Captain Robert H. Bradshaw, 56, retired naval flight surgeon, died at Bethesda Navy Hospital, Friday, April 10, 1970, following brain surgery.

Captain Bradshaw, who had suffered for several years from diabetes, received a concussion Wednesday, April 1, in a fall at his home in Lexington Park, Md., and was taken to the hospital in Lexington Park. Later he was removed to the Bethesda Hospital for surgery, from which he never regained consciousness.

Son of the late Dr. Charles L. Bradshaw, of Duarte, Calif., and a graduate of the United States Naval Academy, Capt. Bradshaw was a frequent visitor in Carlisle.

 Dr. Gordon Wilson Sr., 81, died Sunday, April 13, 1970, at the Bowling Green-Warren County Hospital after a short illness. He was widely known as a folklorist and author and retired as head of the English Department at Western Kentucky University in 1959.

Funeral services were conducted at 2 p.m. Tuesday, April 14, at the State Street United Methodist Church by Dr. Ted High-tower of Bowling Green and the Rev. John E. Taylor of Brook-ridge. Burial in the Fairview Cemetery.

Survivors include the wife, Mrs. Avis Helen Wilson, a daughter, Mrs. Harold Hughes, Portland, Ore.; a son, Dr. Gordon Wilson Jr., five grandchildren and one great grandchild.

Dr. Wilson continued his research in folklore and linguistics, particularly of the Mammoth Cave area of Kentucky, and had published over 50 scholarly articles since his retirement. He was widely read as the author of a column on folklore, "Tid Bits of Kentucky Folklore," which was begun in 1963 and appeared regularly in some 100 state newspapers.

## Council Asks For Survey Before Decision

At its adjourned meeting Tuesday night, City Council asked for a survey of the proposed sewer line before the final decision of whether to run the Arnold sewage or not is made. The question of extension of Arnold sewage will be considered further at a later date.

A building permit was granted (5-1) to John Tapp to repair a roof and construct a porch on East Main, Green and Wood Avenues. It is noted that since the City has an ordinance that all porches be built to the standards of the Planning and Zoning Commission, the action was taken on two other permits which were referred to Council for its recommendation before being considered by Council. One of these petitions stated that he would not put in curb and gutter as is required by the Zoning Ordinance.

Conroy Island will have a new thrill ride when the park opens Saturday, April 25, for a series of four preview weekends. It was reported by Ralph, O. Wachs, Conroy general manager.

The new ride known as the Galaxi, is an Italian-built roller coaster. The all-steel thriller has more than 800 feet of track and includes eight cars, each seating four customers. It is 45 feet high and has banked curves forming a figure eight.
