### Kay's Kitchen

**FRESH GARDEN VEGETABLES**

With so many wonderful fresh garden vegetables around, and all so easy to prepare, seems rather silly to go into complicated recipes, questions or reminders. If you start with green beans—pole beans, half runners, or what have you. Heavily dried kinds known anywhere cook them the way "your" family enjoys them. If you like pork seasoning meat, but do not have and use bacon drippings. Have your fat in plastic tin can with proper top. Use coffee can with plastic top and keep in refrigerator.

I am one of the many who think green beans are better the next day and the next.... They can be the "backbone" of a vegetable dinner. Try this for a carefree meal. Wash the beans and cook through. Serve with a mixture of sliced tomatoes and onions. To keep dish warming at a minimum, serve beans on large platter surrounded by vegetables and corn bread.

Next is summer squash. There are as many ways to cook it as there are varieties. Not too large summer squash or yellow squash is good cooked on top of green beans or in a simple salad, cooked in a minimum amount of water until tender. It takes only a matter of minutes. Serve with salt, butter and pepper. If your family enjoys the creamy, buttery mixture, fry in yellow squash or Zucchini cut in 1/2 inch slices and sauté in a mixture of butter, a crushed garlic clove, salt, pepper and a little water. Sprinkle with Parmesan cheese. You can add a small can of tomato sauce if you wish. Fresh corn is a good "go together" with Zucchini. Good either cooked together or separately. If a nice color combination.

Remember the summer squashes are used when young and tender and do not need to be peeled or seeds removed.

Eggplant is a vegetable fresh from the garden. I have enjoyed this summer, thanks to my friends. This one you do peel but do not remove seeds. My favorite way of preparing eggplant is to peel and fry in half inch slices, fry in oil and fry in bacon drippings until crisp. Then try Baked Eggplant. Fry eggplant slices in oil until onion until soft and browned. In a baking dish, lay half of the browned slices of eggplant on this, add a finely chopped onion, when the cooked onion, season with salt and pepper. Make another layer of eggplant, onion and season again. Sprinkle generously with grated cheddar cheese, dot with butter and bake about 30 minutes in 350 oven. Amounts of ingredients not given depend on size of your family. Now the time to prepare your own recipe in it, in slow, boiled until just tender and serve with butter or use sliced recipe from this column, you already have the best recipe I know for scalloped cabbage.
