REV. HUNTER BLAKELY JR., The Rev. Dr. Hunter Blakely Jr., 76, formerly pastor of churches in Louisville and Harrodsburg, died in St. Petersburg, Fla., Thursday, Aug. 9, 1970.

Retired at the time of his death, he was pastor of the Associate Reformed Presbyterian Church in Louisville (1915-1925); and of the United Presbyterian Church in Harrodsburg (1925-77). He subsequently became secretary of the division of Higher Education of the United Presbyterian Church in the United States.
