### Kay's Kitchen

Peaches, Peaches—now is their season, and as other seasonal food, I enjoy them as often as possible. Remember the season lasts longer than you think. Don't forget the Michigan peaches. They are freestone and just as delicious as any you can get on the market. Let the others be gone.

My favorite way to enjoy this fruit is to just eat it "as is" with the juice running down my chin!

Here are some good recipes that make wonderful desserts.

**PEACH SHORTCAKE**

Use the shortbread recipe I gave you earlier when strawberries were in season. If you didn't save it let me know and I'll reprint it. You will be wanting to use it for many desserts.

In a serving dish, place a square of shortbread, peaches, sprinkled with sugar; another layer of shortbread, peaches. Pour heavy cream over all. You want to serve it up a bit, top with some whipped cream.

**PEACH PIE**

Use a baked pie shell. You can use your recipe for fresh strawberry pie, substituting peaches. Omit the sugar.

2 tablespoons sugar  
1/2 cup sugar  
2 tablespoons flour  
1/2 cup water  
juice of one lemon  
1 tablespoon margarine  
dash of salt

Combine sugar, salt, and flour. Add lemon juice, water and margarine. Cook until thick. Add peaches, almost entirely cooked. Pour over sliced peaches which are arranged in baked pie shell.

This glaze is about enough for 8" or 9" pie shells. Don't forget to have plenty of sliced peaches in the pastry shell.

**PEACHES-'N'-CREAM PIE**

Prepare 1 1/2 cups fine vanilla wafers crumbs. Remove 2 tablespoons crumbs, try to combine remaining crumbs and 1/3 cup melted margarine. Press crumbs through into bottom of 9 inch pie plate until firm, about 45 minutes.

For filling: cream 1/2 cup margarine; gradually stir in 1 1/2 cups sifted confectioners sugar. Add 2 beaten eggs, beat all together till fluffy. Spoon into vanilla wafers crust. Smooth top. Now fold 2 cups drained, sweetened sliced peaches into wafers heavy cream whipped. Spread over egg mixture. Sprinkle reserved crumbs in circle in center of pie. Chill 6 to 8 hours.

You don't have to be so particular about the filling as sweetened condensed. You will tell how many the whipped cream will take. But be sure they are drained well.
