The Carlisle West Homemakers will meet at the United Methodist Church at 11:30 a.m. Friday, Dec. 11.

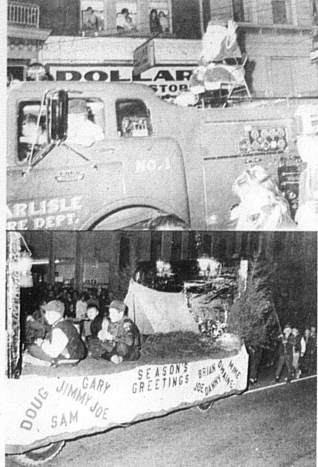
This will be a pot luck dinner, and guests are invited.

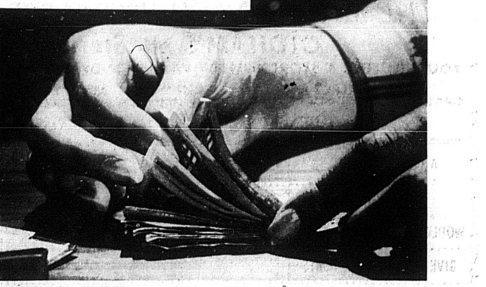
