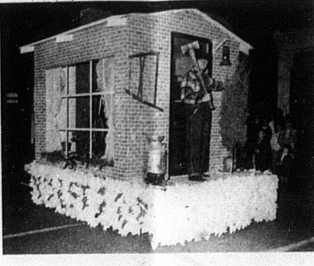




BLUE GRASS INDUSTRIES' "Wizard of Oz" float which appeared in the Joyce Chamber of Commerce Annual Christmas Parade.

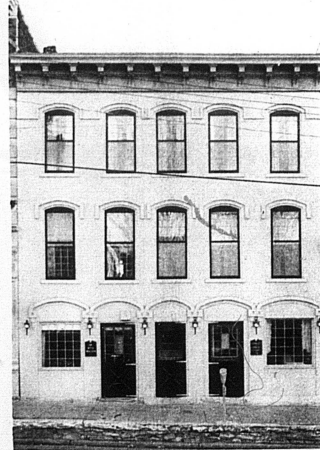
### M. S. U. Holidays Begin This Weekend

The fall semester officially closes at noon Saturday, the earliest fall closing date in MSU's 48-year existence. A new academic calendar launched the fall term in late August and allowed for its earlier completion. Previously, the fall semester at MSU began in mid-September and ended in late January. When the university's more than 6,000 students return to the campus next month, they will be starting a new semester. Registration opens Jan. 11 and classes convene Jan. 14.
