Midnight Mass at Shrine Of Our Lady of Guadalupe

"Christmas is for children" will be the theme of the traditional Midnight Mass this year at the Shrine of Our Lady of Guadalupe. The highlight of the program will be the lighting of the candles by the children's worship of the Christ Child singing "Away in the Manger."

The program will begin with the congregational singing of familiar Christmas Carols at 11:45 p.m. Christmas Eve, Dec. 24. Doors to the church will be open at 11:30 p.m.

The new English Mass will be used for the worship proper. This new Mass consists of two parts: first, the Liturgy of the Word, highlighting the readings from the Sacred Scriptures, and the Liturgy of the Eucharist, consisting of the

sacramental offering, Eucharistic Prayer, and the Communion service. The Rev. Herman B. Kamlage, Administrator of the Shrine Parish, will deliver the homily. In announcing the Midnight Mass program Father Kamlage stressed that this Christmas program of worship was open to the public and that the community is most cordially invited to attend.

The other Masses will be offered Christmas Day, the first, at 10 o'clock in the morning and the second, at noon. In preparation for the Feast of Christmas the Sacrament of Penance will be administered at the following times: Wednesday, Dec. 23, from 4:30 to 5:00; Thursday, Dec. 24, 4:30 to 5:00, and again from 7:30 to 7:50 p.m.

Couey To Retire From Ministry

January will mark the 44th anniversary of Dr. Ralph Couey's ordination to the ministry and will see his retirement from it.

Dr. Couey was ordained by the Seventh and James Baptist Church, Waco, Tex., while a student at Baylor University and pastor of a small rural church near Temple, Tex.

Since 1967, he has served as pastor of the First Lexington Church, East Lexington Avenue, Winchester. He will retire after the first Sunday in January.

Dr. Couey was pastor of the Carlisle Baptist Church from 1934-40.

A graduate of Temple High School, Temple, Tex., Dr. Couey has a bachelor's degree from Baylor University, Waco, Tex., a Ph. D. degree from Southern Baptist Seminary, Louisville, and an honorary D. D. Degree from Georgetown College, Georgetown, Ky.

In Kentucky, Dr. Couey served as pastor at Augustin and Dover while in the seminary and at the Fourth Avenue Baptist Church, Louisville; the Lexington Avenue Baptist Church, Danville, and the First Baptist Church of Carrollton. He moved to Winchester in 1961.

Dr. Couey has served as a member of the Executive Board of the Kentucky Baptist Convention, the Kentucky Board of Child Care, the South District Association,

the White's Run Association and the Ekiborn Association. Dr. Couey resides at 106 Southern Court with his wife, the former Ann Polindexter and her mother, Mrs. Mrs. Wesley Polindexter. Mrs. Couey is guidance counselor at George Rogers Clark High School there. He plans to pursue his hobby of reading, gardening and general upkeep of the home.

Highway Commissioner B. E. King, Frankfort, has announced the addition of four road improvement projects in Nicholas County's 1970-71 County Road Aid Program.

Blumines surfacing is planned for one mile of South Lake Shore Drive (Lake Carnico) from KY 145 Galloway Hill Road to Hickory Ridge Road.

Section C, beginning at Hickory Ridge Road and extending southwest for 0.7 miles.

Section A from Hickory Ridge Road extending southwest for 0.4 mile.

Mint Ridge Road, (near the home of Noble Gilligano) beginning at Goose Creek Road and extending northwest 1.8 miles.

Smith To Be New Social Security Field Representative

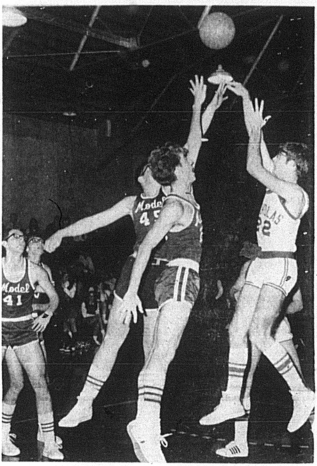
