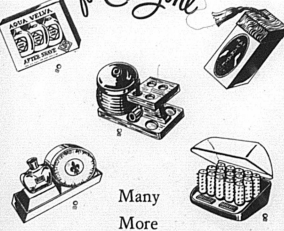

per \$100. But "required local effort" gets into the picture and a rate of 27 cents for schools is required.
Required local effort is established by formula, taking the schools district's assessment percentage of the total state property wealth under assessment.
"Required local effort" is the villain many wanted eliminated from the MEF formula and let the state levy a flat 50 cents as the minimum local requirement to be eligible for state funds.
