The awards program is the culmination of the 1970 "Opportunity

for Progress Program" conducted by the Kentucky Chamber of Commerce under the auspices of its Total Community Development Council and the council's All-Kentucky City project committee.

The noon luncheon and awards program will be held at the Phoenix Hotel, Lexington. Anticipated attendance will represent commu-

nities throughout Kentucky. Delegations are expected to arrive by the busload from those communities which have been striving for outstanding local improvement.

Carlsle is one of the 23 communities reaching the state-wide judging by the out-of-state panel selected to make the final decisions on recognition of those communities having achieved the most in relation to the specific community's potential.
