### V. A. Questions

Q--How can I check to determine whether my wife is the designated beneficiary of my National Service Life Insurance? This may be a vague question. However, my mother, who was beneficiary when I went into service, died recently, and I cannot remember for certain that I filled out any form changing the beneficiary designation to my wife.

A--Write to the Veterans Administration office to which you send your NSLI premium payment and request that you be advised as to the beneficiary who has designated to receive the proceeds of that policy.

In the event that your wife is not the designated beneficiary, ask the VA to send you form (29-330).

It would also be a good idea to check the method of payment you may have previously selected to insure that the proceeds of your policy will be paid to your wife in the manner you desire.

Q--My brother has been in a VA hospital for some three months. His last pension check was reduced to \$30. Why was it reduced? Can it be increased to the amount he received before going into the hospital?

A--Your brother's pension check from the Veterans Administration was reduced to \$30 a month because of a life limiting pension on this amount for veterans without dependents after two calendar months of hospitalization.

Your brother's full pension will be restored after he is released from the VA hospital.

Q--My son received his college degree from the War Relocation Educational Assistance Act. He used his full 16 months entitlement. I am not eligible for up to 36 months of Veterans Administration educational assistance as the widow of a veteran killed during the Korean War. If I don't use my entitlement may my son use part of it?

A--No, your entitlement is not transferable. The purpose of this education and assistance program for widows of veterans who died as the result of military service and the wives of permanently and totally disabled veterans is to enable them to advance their own skills and improve their own education so that they can re-enter the civilian life and maintain an American academic, social and economic life.

However, as a veteran himself, your son will be entitled to an additional 12 months of VA educational assistance as the result of a recent law permitting an aggregate of 48 months of educational assistance under two or more VA programs.

Q--I was awarded a pension from the Veterans Administration last year. My wife and I are planning to sell our home and move to Florida. Will the profit I receive on the sale of the home affect my pension?

A--Not directly. Proceeds from the sale of property are not considered income for veterans under the present pension law. However, you are advised to notify VA of the sale because net worth is also a consideration under the pension law in determining pension entitlement.

While you live in the home its value is not reportable as part of your net worth, but when you convert it to cash, the cash is considered part of net worth.

For further information and assistance in this matter, check with your nearest VA office.

Q--My pension was discontinued because my estate was determined by the Veterans Administration to be excessive. I own 2 bonds jointly with my wife and reported the total maturity value of the bonds as my assets. Is it possible to obtain a different decision on my pension claim?

A--You should write to the VA and point out that your 2 bonds are owned jointly by yourself and your wife. Joint ownership means that your wife's share of the bonds--half their value--will not be considered in determining the value of your estate. Reconsideration of your pension entitlement will be based on your wife's share of the bonds as joint owner.
