City To Formulate New Auto Sticker Ordinance

City Council, at a called meeting Tuesday night, authorized the City Attorney, Fock Conley, to write a new ordinance designating the auto sticker revenue to be used for streets and alleys. The old ordinance earmarks the money to pay for the new fire truck which has now been paid for.

If the Fiscal Court agrees, Council voted to give its permission to the City of Augusta, Ky., to use Carlisle's police radio frequency.

It is the only frequency available to that city at present. The band would include Augusta, Brookville, and the Bracken County Sheriff's Office.

Building permits were granted to Southern States to build an addition on Dorsey Avenue and to Edward Mitchell to build a combined utility room and garage on McCracken Street.

March 1 is the new deadline for farmers to file their final income tax returns and pay their tax in lieu of estimated tax by Jan. 15.

IRS said the Tax Reform Act of 1969 changed the date from Feb. 15 to March 1 for farmers who have not filed their declarations of estimated tax by Jan. 15.

Under the new law these taxpayers may file their Forms 1040 and pay the tax due by March 1 to avoid estimated tax penalties.

Farmers who filed their declarations of estimated tax by Jan. 15, have until April 15 to file their income tax return.

This means farmers will have an additional two weeks to file their income tax return if timely declarations are not filed.

March 2, 1970, is the deadline for 1969 returns because March 1 falls on a Sunday.

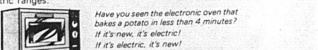
