Kay's Kitchen

This week we move on to lighter salads. There may be one that men will like. If you can always give him a wedge of lettuce with his favorite dressing and you try something different. There are vegetable salads that help make a meal and are prepared ahead of time and may substitute for a vegetable.

STUFFED GREEN PEPPERS
2 medium green peppers
1-8 ounce package of cream cheese
2 tablespoons mayonnaise
1/4 cup minced sweet pickles
1/2 teaspoon minced onion
1/2 cup diced celery
Wash peppers and remove stem, top slice and seed. Blend cheese and remaining ingredients. Fill mixture seems too stiff, add a bit of salad oil. Fill peppers with cheese mixture, packing firmly; chill until firm. Thinly slice peppers crosswise.
For each salad, arrange 2 or 3 slices on lettuce. Garnish with tomato wedges and carraway cut into sticks.
Serve with French Dressing.

BROCCOLI SALAD
2 boxes frozen broccoli (cooled till tender), tops only
6 hard boiled eggs
1 package gelatin
1 can consommé
3/4 cup mayonnaise
A little lemon juice
Salt, Worcestershire Sauce, dash of Tabasco
Chop eggs, add broccoli and lightly fold in mayonnaise. Soak gelatin in 1/4 cup consommé. Heat rest of consommé sufficiently to dissolve gelatin. Add to egg-broccoli mixture. Season well. Spoon into mold. Serve 4. I think this is better if made the day before.

CONGEALED ASPARAGUS SALAD
1 package gelatin
3 packages of cream cheese
1 bottle of Duke's dressing
1 can Party peas (drained)
1 can cut green asparagus--drained (some juice)
1 cup chopped pecans
1 cup diced celery
juice of one lemon
1 chopped green pepper
3 pintenots diced (1 use 1 or 2 small jars of cut pintenots).
Soak gelatin in 1/2 of asparagus juice, heat other half and dissolve soaked gelatin in it. Add all other ingredients. Taste, you may want to add a dash of salt. Spoon into individual molds or into pyrex dish and cut into serving pieces. Serves 10.

PINEAPPLE-CHEESE SALAD
1 package lemon jello
1 cup boiling water
1 cup drained crushed pineapple plus enough water to make 1 cup
1 cup sharp cheddar cheese, grated.
3/4 cup chopped pecans
Dissolve jello in boiling water; add pineapple-water-mixture stirring until jello is dissolved. Refrigerate until thickened. Add in remaining ingredients. Serves 8.
Now I've saved the best for last, this vegetable salad is good anytime. Especially good for buffet supper when you want to keep the dish washing at a minimum.

VEGETABLE SALAD
Make a marinade of 1 cup vinegar; 1 cup sugar; 1/2 cup salad oil; salt and pepper to taste. When sugar is dissolved add 2 cans of french-cut green bean, drained; 1 can drained party peas; 1/2 cup finely cut celery; about 6 small fresh green onions, finely sliced; and 1 small jar cut pintenots. Refrigerate overnight. Serve with apple spoon. Serves 5 or 10.
This salad you can keep going for awhile. Since there will be marinade left, I usually add a small can of peas and one of beans with maybe a bit more onion or celery depending on how much marinade is left.

Nursing Home News

It's always nice to talk to Harvey Ellison. Tuesday he was sitting in his chair enjoying a lap robe his sister, "Miss" Willie Wilmoth, had made him. Harvey was ready to receive visitors for the usual Sunday visitors hadn't come from "home, there and yonder." They had had a family gathering at Blue Licks. Mr. Harvey said he married Christmas 1906 and they had a son, keeping on the John Rogers farm at the mouth of Goose Creek. David Hughes, late husband of Mrs. Ann Hughes, owned a farm about 1/2 miles from the Rogers farm on his farm and Harvey cut the timber at 35¢ a cord. For four cords a day and thought he was really making money. Some years he raised five acres of tobacco; got the tobacco ready for sale in May; had to haul it to Mayville; had 4000 pounds and got four cents a pound. In 1908 Harvey moved to Robertson County. The tobacco "cut out" that year; said he worked for 50¢ per day when he could get it; sometimes could only get forty cents for such work as grubbing, taking rocks, etc. By that time he had three months to feed for his youngest child, Mamie Ellison Lovitt, was several months old.
We are so glad Ward Hammonds is back from the hospital. When asked how he felt his reply was, "nicer than a horse hide and all."
Mrs. Grace Cole was asked if she had any company. She said she could tell how many had been there, for her kids were always
