Adopted By City Council 7-13-70

calendar month. You must work the scheduled work day immediately before and after a paid holiday to receive this benefit.

The department heads should notify the Operations Manager of holiday work schedules one week in advance of each paid holiday. A record of holidays taken and paid annually is to be kept by the Clerk-Treasurer in each personnel file.

VACATION
After one year consecutive service, a REGULAR employee will be eligible for five work days off with pay.

After five years consecutive service, a regular employee will be eligible for fifteen work days off with pay.

The vacation time due should be taken within the year from July 1 to June 30. No days can be accumulated.

The department heads should notify the Operations Manager two weeks in advance when any personnel will be off for vacation benefits so work schedules can be adjusted. A record of vacation days taken and paid annually is to be kept by the Clerk-Treasurer in each personnel file.

HOSPITAL INSURANCE
All REGULAR personnel are invited to participate in the group hospital insurance plan the City carries with Blue Cross. You are eligible to enroll after 6 months continuous service. Please notify

and after completing six months consecutive service. You must be confined to your home or a hospital due to illness and after two days present a doctor's statement to be eligible for this benefit. Special cases will be given individual consideration by the Council.

When off on sick leave after two days it is required that you present a doctor's statement showing dates that he has advised you to be off work. If for any reason you cannot report back to work at the time the doctor's statement suggests, then you must contact the Operations Manager prior to that date.

The time you are off on an approved Sick Leave will not be counted against your service record. While you are on an approved leave your benefits are frozen, and upon returning to work you will be eligible for the same benefits you were before your illness.

The Clerk will keep a record of all sick leave benefits paid in the permanent personnel file along with the official medical statement.

GOVERNMENT RETIREMENT BENEFITS
When you reach 62 or 65 years of age and wish to retire, you will receive a monthly payment from the Social Security Board. The cost of your retirement pay is shared equally between you and the City of Carlisle. (This benefit applies to all personnel classifications).

The Council reserves the right to revise or amend these benefits as needed.
