Preliminary Figures Show Small Census Drop

The preliminary population figures for the places listed below were announced today by District Manager John M. Simons who supervised the taking of the 1970 Census of Population and Housing in this area.

(Editor's Note: For the first time in several decades Nicholas County's population loss fell below 5%. A ten per cent loss has been noted in previous census counts.)

Nicholas County's 1970 (Preliminary) figure is 6,379, the 1960 (Official) 6,577 or 298 less.
