Apollo II Capsule To Be Shown In Frankfort

The Apollo II capsule, the space vehicle that carried the first man to the moon will go on display in Frankfort Sept. 11-15, Gov. Louie B. Nunn announced recently.

The Frankfort exhibit of the historic space ship is one step in a 50-state tour. The Apollo II flight in mid-April with the space vehicle and a display of moon rocks will be shown to each state capital.

Governor Nunn expressed hope that all Kentuckians would take advantage of the opportunity to visit the traveling space exhibit.

Apollo II is the space vehicle that carried Astronauts Neil A. Armstrong and Edwin E. Buzz Aldrin to the surface of the moon last July.

The moon shot was launched from Kennedy Space Center, Fla., Jan. 16, 1969, and carried Spacecraft Commander Armstrong, and Astronauts Aldrin and Michael Smith into lunar orbit beyond Armstrong and Aldrin descended to the moon's surface in the landing module.

The first men on the moon brought back the samples of moon rocks and soil. Apollo II returned to earth and splashed down in the Pacific July 24, 1969.

sale of personal property made after May 27, 1969, for a price of more than \$1,000 are subject to the new rules in cases when the seller reports his gain in installments extending over two or more years.

The investment credit in most cases ended April 18, 1969, Mr. Dahn said. However, the investment credit is available for property bought, built, or rebuilt under a binding contract entered into before April 19, 1969, or in certain other transitional situations.

The use of accelerated depreciation of real property acquired after July 24, 1969, has been limited, but a 60-month write-off of air or water pollution control facilities has been added for 1969 returns.
