When the home economics program is mentioned, people usually think of cooking and sewing. However, when we talk of this program we must include a number of other things. The goal of vocational home economics is to provide better homes and family living conditions.

The home economics program is most often presented to the public through the Future Homemakers of America. Through this national organization, students receive valuable experience in home-making activities through extracurricular work.

Other aspects of this program include community and home experience as well as home visits. The importance of a good appearance in the home is stressed. The students are also instructed in the preparation of meals as well as the other aspects, good table manners and the basic health needs.

Household methods are reviewed and architectural styles are studied in the unit on housing. A valuable side-light of this unit is the study of floor plans and such according as wiring and lighting.
