



### Ky. Conference Women's Society Of Christian Service To Meet

Immanuel United Methodist Church, Ft. Mitchell will be the site of the Second Annual Meeting of the Kentucky Conference of the Women's Society of Christian Service and its auxiliary service clubs on April 3 and 4. The meeting will begin at 8:30 a.m.

Mrs. Wayne W. One new and unique plant pointed out by Secretary of Agriculture Clifford Hardin in his coronation address opening the Festival, was another plant—otherwise known as "Mother-In-law's tongue. While declaring not all Mothers-in-law could be bad, Secretary Hardin noted the plant was "tough, pointed, brittle, but not forked."

The many unique plants displayed were some not so new, but selected especially for their ability to enjoy by both young boys and girls. In fact, the touch of these plants. It was this mature thirteen year old's description of these plants which were translated into brilliant for others. blind new characteristics of some plants. Did you know, mint grows on a square stem? Gardens for the blind have been established now in several parks, including the National Arboretum.
