Kay's Kitchen By Kay Fisher

This week is going to be "Special Dessert" week. These recipes are good for special occasions or to just give yourself a treat. Some are light and good to serve after a filling meal. Some of them are rich and good anytime you can sneak your mind to calories. Don't know how far the first recipe I always make at the same time. They are both light and each one calls for 1/2 cup cream, whipped and since whipping cream comes in an eight-ounce carton or bottle (1 cup), I make both desserts. You are in luck, though both of these recipes were in my family and were made many times. I always wonder now you know because the nicest thing of all, one of the desserts you put in the freezer and it will keep for weeks.

LEMON DESSERT
Cook 3 egg yolks and juice of one lemon, grate the lemon rind--it should make about 1 tablespoon. Anyway, the rind of the one lemon is enough, and 1/2 cup sugar until thick, stirring almost constantly. Beat 3 egg whites until stiff, add 1/2 cup sugar. Beat 1/2 cup whipping cream. Fold cooled lemon mixture into beaten egg whites then fold in whipped cream. Line ice tray with crushed graham cracker crumbs. Cover tightly with foil. This, if frozen hard, can be sliced. However I have found it has more flavor if not so cold. So spoon it into a serving dish and you may add a spoon of prepared whipped topping if you wish. Serves 6 to 8 depending on size of sherbet glass.

PLAIN FLUFF PARFAIT
1 package raspberry jello
1 cup hot water
1 1/2 cups of whipped cream
2 1/2 size can of Purple Plums--(Note: use only best grade canned plums) Wash and drain until well drained. Drain again and frosty. Fold in 1/2 cup cream, whipped, and the plum cut up. Should be a cup--a bit more won't hurt.
File lightly into parfait glasses. Should serve 8. If your parfait glasses are a larger size, put 1 tablespoon of prepared whipped topping in bottom of glass and also top with topping. Refrigerate until serving time.
Don't be led astray and use prepared whipped topping instead of whipping cream. It just won't work. You will be disappointed.

PINEAPPLE ICE BOX CAKE
Combine 2 cups crushed pineapple, 1/2 cup sugar, 1/2 cup chopped pecans, 1/4 cup melted butter. Line bottom of pyrex oblong dish about 13x9 with a layer of crushed vanilla wafer, then a layer of pineapple mixture and so on, ending with crumbs. Refrigerate overnight. To serve: Slice into squares and top with whipped cream and a peach half. This is a good ingertine being so easy to prepare.

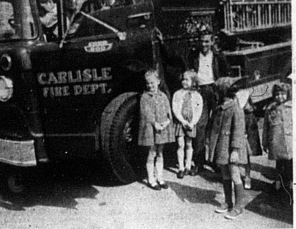
CHOCOLATE PUDDING
Sift together 1 cup flour (left before measuring), 1/4 teaspoon salt, 3/4 cup sugar, 2 tablespoons melted butter, 1 teaspoon vanilla. Pour in greased baking dish (medium sized casserole). Cover with 1/2 cup white sugar, 1/2 cup of brown sugar, 1 rounded tablespoon cocoa. Overpour a cup of water. Bake one hour in moderate oven at 325 degrees.
A chocolate sauce forms in bottom of baking dish and a cake forms at top. Cover with whipped cream and serve hot. Delicious!
