**Kay's Kitchen**

Since we had several good recipes come to us this week, I do want to pass them on to you. As you can tell this column is written according to mood, requests, recipes sent in or what have you. The following recipe was sent to me by Mrs. Adela C. Oldham, Louisville. Though I haven't tried it, I know it will be good if she says it is. "It is a rich cake that keeps well and is one operation."

**SPICE CAKE - BAKED ON ICING**  
 Cream 1 cup shortening and 2 cups brown sugar, beating constantly. Spread over raw dough. Sprinkle with nut meats.  
 Bake at 300 degrees for 325 degrees for perhaps as long as 1 hour and 15 minutes. Test with cooking thermometer. Must be low because of the meringue topping. -Mrs. Adela C. Oldham.

**Chocolate Delight**  
 8 double ladyfinger's, split  
 1/3 cup brandy, or bourbon whiskey  
 1/3 cup finely chopped or ground almonds  
 1/4 cup butter  
 1/2 cup sugar  
 2 squares of sweet chocolate  
 1/4 cup milk  
 1 egg yolk  
 1 teaspoon vanilla

In the top of a double boiler, melt the chocolate. Beat eggs and add brandy and sugar. Beat mixture gradually to the chocolate. Stir all the time. Cook, stirring all of the time over hot water until the mixture is smooth. Add butter and sugar. Mix and blend well. Take from heat and beat until smooth with a rotary beater, or use electric beater. Cool to room temperature. Using a spatula, divide the ladyfinger's into halves. Dip one half of the ladyfinger's on a serving platter. Lightly drizzle the flavor of your choice over the ladyfinger's. Place the other half of ladyfinger's on top, matching top half with lower half. Drizzle the other half of liquor over the top layer of ladyfinger's. Let stand 15 minutes. In the top of a double boiler, melt the chocolate mixture. Chill well. Two ladyfinger's, both halves that is, make a serving. Use dollop, and can be done so quickly and the chilling takes the dessert off your mind for a last-minute duty.

Use your prettiest cake plate for this. It is a good dessert to serve buffet style. You don't have to worry about it collapsing or falling apart and is for guests to serve themselves. The portions are obvious.
