A gun deer season of five days in all counties of Kentucky was approved by the Fish and Wildlife Resources Commission in meeting Monday at the offices of the Department of Fish and Wildlife Resources. The season will open on Nov. 14 and continue through Nov. 18. Hunting is restricted to bucks with antlers or spots visible above the hairline in all counties except three in these three. Bar-

at 120 counties, there will be no election because of the lack of a seat--and the polls will not be open.

The counties are in the Second Congressional District, where incumbent U.S. Rep. William H. Natcher, D-Bowling Green, has no opposition either in the primary or the Nov. 3 general election.

Unless there is a special election, there will be no primary elections in the Second District counties of Allen, Breckinridge, Daviess, Edmonson, Grayson, Hancock, Meade, Ohio, Simpson and Warren.

Warren County Clerk Charles W. Morehead said he knows of special local elections in the district. Neither did Daviess County Clerk Robert Neel.

The reason the polls will be open, from 6 a.m. to 6 p.m., local time, in the 10 other counties of the Second District is because these counties also are in the Third Appellate District which has contests in both parties for nomination for judge of the Court of Appeals.

The candidates in both the Republican and Democratic primaries, because of the cross-filing allowed, are incumbent Appellate Judge C. Homer Nelitz, R-Somerset, and Appellate Court Commissioner Bernard B. Davis, D-Sheylville.

Second Congressional District counties which will have polls open to vote in the contests for the judicial nominations are Anderson, Bullitt, Hardin, Hart, Letcher, Marion, Nelson, Spencer and Washington.

The primary is what politicians sometimes call an off-year election. It principally is for the selection of party nominees for Kentucky's seven seats in the U.S. House of Representatives.

There is no statewide contest, and Acting Secretary of State Mary R. Galvez says a light vote is expected.

All incumbent congressmen are seeking re-nomination and re-election, besides Natcher, they are: First District, Frank A. Stubblefield, D-Murray; Third, William O. Cowger, R-Louisville; Fourth, Gene Snyder, R-Jefferson-town; Fifth, Tim Lee Carter, R-Tompkinsville; Sixth, John C. Watts, D-Nicholasville; Seventh, Carl D. Perkins, D-Hindman.

Of this group, Cowger and Perkins have no primary opposition. No Republican filed in the First District, Lyle Leonard Willis, Corbin, Fifth District Democrat, is unopposed.

Other action included: A change in the daily creel limit of rainbow trout from five to eight, with a possession limit of eight also. This is not to apply until Jan. 1, 1971. Also, the creel and possession limit of rockfish was set at five, with a size limit of 15 inches. This also is not to be effective until Jan. 1, 1971. Barren River Reservoir and its tributaries were opened to walleye fishing in all months except February and March. Licking River, up to a point adjacent to Highway 111 on the Bath and Fleming county line, was opened to commercial fishing throughout the year, and the mesh size of trammel and gill nets used in the Mississippi River was reduced from four inches to three inches, bar measure. No further changes in commercial net sizes are contemplated for a number of years, Commissioner Nitch Clark said.

The Commission also agreed to the production of a new film on fishing and water management, to be produced within the next year. Hunting dates previously set were: Squirrel, Aug. 15 through Dec. 31; and Nov. 19 through Dec. 31. Limits will apply to all deer and 12 rabbit and quail, Nov. 19 through Jan. 31. The limit on both species is unchanged from last year at six and 12 for rabbits and 10 and 20 for quail. Fur-bearers, (trapping season), Nov. 19 through Jan. 31. Grouse, Nov. 19 through Feb. 28, with limits of four and eight.
