Ockerman Accepts Post in Combs Campaign

Foster Ockerman, prominent Lexington attorney and one of Kentucky's leading Democrats, today accepted the post of State Finance Chairman for the campaign of Bert Combs for Governor and Julian Carroll for Lt. Governor.

The announcement was made by former Governor Combs at his state campaign headquarters in Louisville.

Ockerman, a Navy veteran of World War II, has held a number of posts in government and top leadership posts in the Democratic Party. In 1954-55 was president of the Young Democrat Clubs of Kentucky. From 1964 through 1966 he served as chairman of the Democratic State Central Executive Committee.

Ockerman served three terms as a member of the Kentucky House of Representatives, from 1959 through 1962, as state commissioner of Motor Transportation under Governor Combs.

"I look forward to the campaign and eventual re-election of one of Kentucky's finest Governors," Ockerman said today. "I know his vigorous, far-seeing leadership will get Kentucky back on the move."

Ockerman is a graduate of the University of Kentucky, with AB and JD degrees. He is presently serving as president of the Board of Trustees of the Kentucky Annual Conference of the United Methodist Church, and is a Mason, Kiwanian and an Elk.
