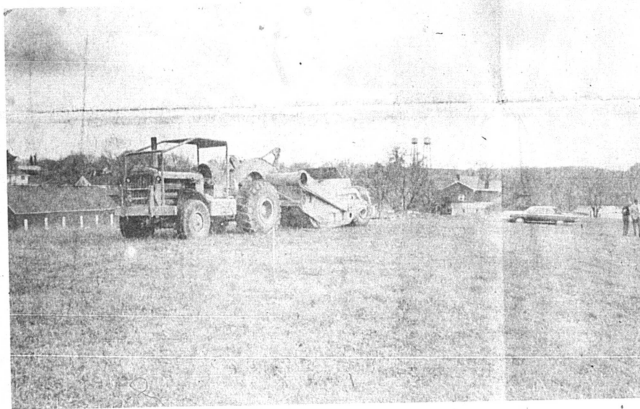

#### U.S. Bond Sales

Are 2,407 in Sept.

The sales of E and H Savings Bonds in Nicholas County for September were \$2,407, while sales for the year reached \$35,540 or 33.1% of the annual goal of \$107,250. Sales a year ago were \$50,753.

Kentucky's sales for the month were \$4,971,482 while cumulative sales for the nine months totaled \$42,309,706 or 79.3% of the annual goal of \$53,300,000. Sales a year ago were \$46,168,618.

Pennington Company was awarded the contract for the building at a bid of \$1,215,500 with the building to be completed in 240 days. The dedication of the church building of the First Christian Church (Disciples of Christ), Catherine Street, Kennedy Heights, will be held at 3 p.m. Sunday, Nov. 15. Rev. John Vickers, Burlington, Ia., will be the guest speaker. Others taking part in the service will be former ministers Dr. Richard Pope, Lexington, and Rev. Ambrose Stump, Princeton, W.V.

The church was organized and held its first services May 8, 1906, at the Old Concord Church. In June 1960 the congregation purchased property on Locust Street and after extensive remodeling the lower floor provided an auditorium and Sunday School rooms. The upper floor was used as a parsonage. This served the congregation until this year when ground was donated by Mr. and Mrs. Russell Alexander, and ground breaking ceremonies were held March 22, 1970.

The first services were held in the new building on Oct. 11, 1970. The Rev. Neil Thompson, minister will preside at the service Sunday.

An invitation has been extended to the public to attend the service and ministers and congregations in neighboring towers have been invited.

There will be special music. An open-house and reception will be held after the dedication.

This is the first church to be built in 64 years. The Carlisle Christian Church was built in 1899; Methodist, 1904; Presbyterian, 1901; Baptist, 1904; Catholic, 1906.

Other activities of the church will be Nov. 16, Men's Prayer Breakfast at 7 a.m., with Rev. John Vickers as guest speaker; Nov. 17, at 6:30 p.m., Ted Luck supper in the fellowship hall.
