year, the state-local tax burden came to approximately \$1,344,000. The financial needs of local governments are rising rapidly as a result of the cost of materials, equipment, services and capital improvements continue to expand in line with price rises in other areas of the economy.

In some communities, the amount spent for local government operations is adequately covered by their revenues. In many others, however, it has been necessary to go deeper into debt financing.
